Subject:-Grant of 2nd Renewal of Permission to Basavaraj Patil Memorial Ayurvedic Medical Hospital & Research Centre, Near Sindenkera Cross, NH-65, Veerabhadragiri, Humnabad, Basava Kalyan, Bidar-560073, Karnataka (Inst. ID AYU0844) with 95 seats (instead of 100 seats) in UG (BAMS) course, under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2026-27 and relevant regulations thereunder-reg.

Sir/Madam,

1. To assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **Basavaraj Patil Memorial Ayurvedic Medical Hospital & Research Centre, Near Sindenkera Cross, NH-65, Veerabhadragiri, Humnabad, Basava Kalyan, Bidar-560073, Karnataka (Inst. ID AYU0844)** inspection was conducted on **04.06.2026 and 05.06.2026 in hybrid mode** as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process the **2nd Renewal of Permission with 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2026-27, under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020.**
2. The visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulations namely the Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals Regulations, 2024" provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations thereunder. **On careful examination of the assessment report the shortcomings/defects were observed** and the same was placed in the **167th Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on **30.07.2026. Board discussed and decided to seek clarification from the college regarding the shortcomings found during assessment.**
3. **Further, in adherence to the principles of natural justice, an opportunity of clarification vide letter even no. dated 06.08.2026 was provided to you. In response of the same you have submitted the clarification through a letter with ref .no. BPMAMC/OFF-62/2026 dated 10.08.2026.**
4. The clarification report was placed in the **179th Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) convened on 18.09.2026 and Board discussed and decided to partially consider the faculty and ask for monetary penalty three times of the minimum salary per faculty for each month of the delayed period from the college as per Regulation 36(3) of MESAR UG (Ay) 2024 and recalculate the seats as per punitive policy and Concerned Acts and regulations.**
5. **Further, a letter of imposed monetary penalty was issued to you vide even letter of .no. dated 23.09.2026. In response of the same you have submitted a letter ref. no. BPMAMCH/off/NCISM-76/2026 dated 24.09.2026 regarding submission of imposed monetary penalty as per Regulation 36(3) of MESAR UG 2024.**

❖ **As per the "Punitive Policy for the academic session 2026-27"**

- i) **"For each deficient teaching faculty, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 5% of total intake capacity."**

As per the observation, there is shortcoming of 01 higher faculty in each department of Ayurved Samhita & Siddhant as the faculty has raised relieving of teacher on OTMS from previous institute and is still not linked in the current institute. Therefore, shortcoming persists.

There is deficiency of total **01 teaching faculties**, therefore **seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 05% of total intake capacity (i.e. Reduction of 05 seats).**

6. Accordingly, after applying the seat reduction policy 2026-27 under section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020, college is fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of **2nd Renewal of Permission with seat reduction with intake capacity of 95 seats (instead of 100 seats) in UG (BAMS) course, for the academic session 2026-27 under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020.**

"DECISION"

7. **Therefore, 2nd Renewal of Permission with seat reduction in accordance with Regulation 64 (3) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024 and is hereby granted to Basavaraj Patil Memorial Ayurvedic Medical Hospital & Research Centre, Near Sindenkera Cross, NH-65, Veerabhadragiri, Humnabad, Basava Kalyan, Bidar-560073, Karnataka (Inst. ID AYU0844) with intake capacity of 95 seats (instead of 100 seats) in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2026-27 , under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 subject to the condition that following conditions shall be fulfilled :-**
- I. **Minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity with 95 seats (instead of 100 seats) shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2026-27 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.****
8. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
9. Further, **as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020**, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then **in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.**
10. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
11. **Compliance of all the requirements of Aadhaar Enabled Biometric Attendance System as mentioned in the Implementation letters vide. Ref. no. 3/2024/MARB/AEBAS & HMS. Dated 09.05.2024 & 06.09.2024 issued by the Board.**
12. **The following requirements must be fulfilled and the compliance report must reach the Board by 31st December, 2026 to be considered for the issuance of permission for the academic session 2027-2028:-**
- All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled.
 - All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
 - All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.
13. The College administration will ensure that sufficient qualified teachers and non-teaching staff in the college and requisite staff in the hospital, as per the NCISM ACT and relevant regulation thereunder, are in position before the admission of 3rd batch of students in the 1st professional BAMS is made under intimation to the Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM.
14. The college has to develop the requisite infrastructure for I, II and III professionals well in time in accordance with the Regulation (66) of MESAR 2024 which will be verified by the medical assessment and rating board and accordingly the permission for taking admissions in subsequent academic session will be considered.

15. The college administration may take up the matter for recognition of the qualification under section 35 of the NCISM Act, 2020 at that time when the first batch of students admitted against this course appears for the first final professional examination of the said course.
16. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college within the timeline as mentioned above to the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the renewal of permission for the academic session 2027-28.
17. Further, in case you are not satisfied with the decision of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM, you may prefer an appeal addressed to the Chairman, NCISM, within 15 days of issuance of the decision of the Board as per regulation 65 of MESAR 2024 and section 29(5) of NCISM Act 2020.

Note: - It is also noted that, if the concerned University does not grant affiliation to the college or withdraws the affiliation, the permission granted by MARB-ISM shall automatically withdrawn without any further notice or order.
